

Today's Mass: Thirtieth Sunday (Year A)

First Reading: this is part of the Sinai covenant God established with Moses, one of the covenants referred to in the phrase "time and again you offered them covenants" in Eucharistic Prayer IV.

Old Testament religion was not just about ritual; there was a strong ethical component, especially concerning justice and economic assistance for the poor.

Psalm: this psalm of praise of God is also - mysteriously - found almost word for word in 2 Samuel 22.

Second Reading: St Paul praises the faith of the Thessalonian Christians, who have converted from their former idolatry. The strength of their faith "has spread everywhere".

Gospel: Jesus summarises the Law in the double commandment of love: we must love God and love neighbour, the two are inextricable. St John Chrysostom said: "to love God is to love one's neighbour". Perhaps we might take some time this week to reflect on our own love of God and of neighbour. The two go together: to love God truly is to love one's neighbour, to love one's neighbour truly is to love God (see I John 4: 20 - 21).

In an age when the word 'love' has become debased, it is important to remember that love here is not just thinking warm, fuzzy thoughts about God or about people. It means being totally committed to God, in our prayer and moral life, and it means meeting the practical needs of our neighbours who need help as best as we can.



A Twenty year Relationship with St Thomas's (part II) By MGr Boniface

A Malawian proverb says, "katungwe nkukankhana" which literally means for you to swing you need somebody to push you. It means we need each other to succeed in life, nobody in this world can attribute all success to himself alone. Today I come to you with gratitude for what your parish has been to me over the years. As a student in Rome you took care of me, giving me shelter during the summer holidays. When I went back home to continue my work as a priest you continued to give a hand to make my work easier. All assistance has come from the One World and from some Christians who took individual interest in my work. I cannot find the right words to thank you enough. God alone can reward you in the way he knows best.

With your prayers and financial assistance, I have been able to carry out some activities related to my work in Malawi. While teaching at St Anthony Major Seminary, your parish helped with the painting of the Administration block. It is a long building about 100 meters long, it houses offices for all members of staff and the ground floor is a hostel for thirty students. I was also helped with the purchase of new iron sheets and the fixing of a new roof for the laundry of the seminary. The laundry is a big block where all cassocks for the 120 major seminarians and the clothes of all members of staff are cleaned. Its roof was in part grass thatched and used to leak.

Next to the seminary is Kachebere Parish. I used to help on Sundays with masses. I would go with the seminarians to the villages to pray with the people. In this way I came in contact with the people. One of the Churches had a very bad roof and with financial assistance from here we were able to buy new iron sheets and the parish priest repaired the roof.

My contacts with the community made me appreciate the needs of the people. I began to work with some communities around the seminary. I worked with three community based orphanages namely Chifundo Orphanage, Tidzuke Women's Group and Kaligwenje Orphanage. The people seeing the plight of the orphans and vulnerable children, and the suffering of those who were HIV positive, with the help of local village heads started these support groups. I was approached if I could help. Through the local leadership the orphanages were assisted with money for food, school fees for needy students, clothes and some monetary contribution towards the construction of their orphanages. It has been quite satisfying to see some of the students we helped become teachers, clinical officers, bankers etc coming out of the trap of poverty.

Another place that has been helped out of this relationship is Pius XII Seminary, my former school where I was once Rector. Pius XII Seminary was experiencing severe water shortages. We were able to help with two water pumps, a submersible water pump and a ground water pump and this helped to reduce water problems at the school. We also helped with the construction of a teacher's house, the provision of enviro loo toilets and recently (last year 2016) we assisted with the purchase of twenty five desks each sitting two students.

Two years ago the Archdiocese renovated the buildings of the former Montfort Press premises at Limbe Cathedral (where I minister) and turned them into a High School. The school has now 320 students who are boarders. So far the school has received assistance from this parish that has enabled it to buy voltmeters and ammeters, four microscopes and 320 school books. As the school has just started, the needs are enormous but we believe the situation will improve with continued investment.

I come from Chiringa Parish which is in a remote area on the border with Mozambique. The diocese runs a Health Centre at the Parish through the Sisters of the Blessed Virgin Mary. For some years we gave help to the Sisters towards the purchase of medicines and when the Health Centre caught fire and was burnt five years ago, some money was contributed towards the new roof.

The Archdiocese of Blantyre is blessed with vocations to the priesthood and struggles to pay the fees for its seminarians. A couple in Sevenoaks has year after year made a contribution to the archdiocese to help with the formation of three seminarians.

Once again I would like to thank the Catholic Parish of St Thomas (Sevenoaks) for the warm welcome accorded to me over the years and for all that has been achieved. What is amazing is that all was done with private donations made out of personal interest in improving the lives of people in Malawi. I am very grateful to you all and I think that with God's continued assistance it is possible to reach out to more people in my country. Do pray for me as I hope to celebrate my silver jubilee next year and hope to see you then. God bless.

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

Mass Intentions & Holy Souls Masses



Whenever Mass is celebrated, it embraces all human beings, living and dead. The benefits of each Mass are infinite and include the whole world. Every Mass encompasses the Church triumphant (in heaven) as well as the Church militant (here on earth). Nevertheless the practice has grown up over the centuries of having a Mass celebrated for a particular intention, such as the repose of the soul of someone who has died, healing for a sick person, God's blessing on a wedding or confirmation, or God's guidance for someone in difficulties.

This special intention means that those for whom that Mass is offered participate in a special way in the grace of the Eucharistic Sacrifice. It is also a good way for the person requesting the intention to unite themselves with the Mass, to share in the fruits of the Mass, and to express their belief that God accepts our prayers and responds to them as a loving and gracious father. If someone has been bereaved and receives a Mass card from you, for instance, they will often take great comfort and solace from knowing that their departed loved one is being prayed for. Even non-Catholics usually appreciate this.

It has become customary for the person requesting the Mass intention to make a donation to the priest. These are often called "Mass stipends", but we must be clear that there is not - and can not be - any set fee or charge. It must always be an offering, freely given. The offering is an act of almsgiving in which the donor provides for the sustenance of the priest. To put this another way: the donation you make with your Mass intention is the amount of money the priest has to live on that day.

In the early church, the faithful brought gifts to Mass to support the clergy and to assist the poor and those in need. Often these gifts would be items from the farm or garden, such as vegetables or a chicken (which is the origin of the celebrant washing his fingers after receiving the gifts at Mass, to wash off any dirt on them). Later, this offering came to be made in money (at least in Europe; in Africa, if Archbishop Peter were to visit a parish he might be given a goat or some other live animal!).

Dioceses or national Bishops' Conferences have to make rulings about certain aspects. For example, people put money in wall boxes for Holy Souls Masses; how many Masses does this represent? In Southwark every £10 is applied to one Holy Souls Mass. Each priest concelebrating a Mass can apply one intention; in our parish usually the principal celebrant offers the advertised intention, while the concelebrants offer the Holy Souls Masses. It is good to continue the custom of Holy Souls Masses, if only so that our successors will continue to offer Mass for us when we have died and are in purgatory.

Finally, it is worth remembering that anyone can make an intention at a Mass; you simply silently say a prayer asking God to apply that Mass for whatever intention you wish. What the celebrant announces - or what is listed in the weekly newsletter - is the intention for which the priest is offering the Mass. And your Mass offering is your generous response to the infinite grace and gifts we receive from God every time a Mass is offered. To book a Mass intention write the details on the Mass envelope, put your donation inside, and hand it in (to the office, collection or priest).
