

Today's Mass: Thirty-Second Sunday (Year A)

First Reading: 'Wisdom' refers to Christ. As the Gospel also warns us we must be on the alert for Him. (Don't be misled by the 'her': wisdom is grammatically feminine in Hebrew.)

Psalm: this is a warm and fervent expression of longing for and love of God.

Second Reading: St Paul explains what will happen at the Lord's Second Coming, when all those who have died in Christ will be raised and taken up into heaven.

Gospel: the translation 'bridesmaids' (the Greek words means 'maidens') is a bit misleading; the young women were groomsmaids rather than bridesmaids. However, the main point is clear: the foolish ones are not ready when the great moment finally arrives. However many years go by, we must be spiritually ready at all times so that we can greet Christ when He comes to us, whether unexpectedly in a brother or sister in need or on the Day of Judgement after our death.

Today is also **Remembrance Sunday**, and we remember members of the armed forces who have lost their lives in the line of duty:

*They shall grow not old, as we that are left grow old:
Age shall not weary them, nor the years condemn.
At the going down of the sun and in the morning
We will remember them.*

Sevenoaks food bank - Loaves & fishes

Loaves and Fishes is the Food Bank to which St Thomas' Church contribute bimonthly.

Loaves and Fishes Food Bank was established in July 2011 and became a registered charity in 2012. It was set up to support the local community in Sevenoaks and surrounding villages with the simple ethos of food in (donations) and food out (recipients). It supports families with children. We started with supporting 8 families and now support around 40 families. We provide a bag of tinned and dried food each week and fresh fruit when we are able to. Loaves and Fishes operates thanks to the goodwill of St John's Church, Quakers Hall Lane, Sevenoaks who allow use of their premises to store food and to distribute to our recipients.

Families are referred to the Food Bank by a variety of organisations. These include Headteachers, Health Visitors, Mental Health teams, Debt Counsellors, Victim Support teams, Citizens Advice and Church leaders to name just a few. We will support families for as long as the referring organisation sees a need for our help; it is not our judgement to make. The length of time varies. In the case of domestic abuse victims it could be for as little as a week or in the case of long-term unemployment due to ill health or having to care for a sick child it could be for many months as benefits often fall short of what is required. We will never turn anyone away who has been referred to us. It is wonderful when a recipient tells us that they no longer need our help; we will always support them in an emergency without the need for a referral. Increasingly we are seeing more homeless people. Although we do not support single people long-term we will help out for a maximum of 4 weeks as we are limited by the storage space and the commitment to our existing recipients.

At Easter every child receives an Easter Egg, courtesy of St Mary's Church, Kippington. At Christmas families have a hamper donated by Sevenoaks Lions, as well as a Christmas cake, Christmas pudding, clementines and mince pies all donated by local churches. The children also receive an Advent calendar thanks to St Mary's Kippington. A local charity, Free Cakes For Kids, bake a cake for each child on their birthday; the cakes are amazing and to see a child's face light up when they receive their cake is wonderful.

As well as providing much needed food we also offer cups of tea and biscuits and a listening ear every Thursday. Although we cannot give professional advice we are able to provide information about local services such as Spring House Children's Centre, Debt Advice and Citizens Advice.

Loaves and Fishes can not exist without the donations from the local community which are needed all year round. However, it is the volunteers who give up their time that keeps Loaves and Fishes going. Every tin and packet has to be checked to make sure it is within the sell by date and then stored according to sell by date. A very time consuming process! We want to continue to support everyone who comes through the door needing our help.

We are open every Thursday between 1pm and 4pm when donations can be dropped off. If you are interested in learning more and perhaps volunteering please contact us at sevenoaksfoodbank@gmail.com

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

What is the Sacrament of Confirmation?



As the Archbishop is coming to Confirm some young people on Saturday 25th November, it is timely to have a look at the Sacrament of Confirmation, which is the second stage of Christian Initiation after Baptism.

There is, perhaps, more debate about Confirmation than about any of the other sacraments. Put simply, in the earliest years of the Church - when Christianity was new and so people were adults when they became Christians - the original order of the sacraments of initiation was Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Communion. The Baptism and the Chrismation (or anointing) was always performed by the Bishop. But as more and more people, including children, were becoming Christians this gradually became impossible.

A divergence developed between the East and the West. In most of the Eastern churches (the Oriental Rite Catholics, the Orthodox churches, and the historic Eastern churches) Confirmation came to be conferred by the priest at the same time as the Baptism. This kept the link between Baptism and Confirmation.

In the West (including the Roman Rite, of which the Archdiocese of Southwark is part) the opposite happened. Confirmation came to be detached from Baptism, and was conferred when the Bishop happened to visit. This retained the link between Confirmation and the Bishop.

Different dioceses in the West developed different practices, and so the order of the sacraments and the age for Confirmation and First Confession and First Holy Communion varies considerably. In England & Wales each diocesan Bishop decides his own policy. In the Archdiocese of Southwark the Diocesan Policy states that candidates should generally be a minimum of 12 years (ie Year 8). Remote preparation is provided in Year 8 by the Catholic secondary school, while proximate

preparation is provided in the parish. Also, to retain the link between Baptism and Confirmation, one of the candidate's godparents should act as Sponsor, where possible.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* tells us that Confirmation is so called because it confirms and strengthens Baptismal grace. Among other things Confirmation deepens the gifts of the Holy Spirit received in Baptism, strengthens our bonds with the Church, empowers us for our mission in the world, and helps us to bear witness to our Christian faith in word and deed (see CCC 1316).

Despite the debate about the order of the sacraments of initiation and the appropriate age, there are two important points we can make. First, Confirmation is not an optional extra. "Every Baptised person not yet confirmed can and should receive the sacrament of Confirmation" (CCC 1306). Notice the word 'should'. Every Baptised Catholic over the age of 12 should be Confirmed, and so complete their Christian initiation. It is not a sort of extra for particularly keen Catholics. If you are over 12 and have not been Confirmed, ask me to arrange it.

Secondly, Confirmation is not - as some Protestant groups have it - a personal affirmation of faith by those about to become adults (see CCC 1308). It is not about *us* affirming *our* faith in God; rather it is about *God* confirming *his* grace first given in Baptism. Thus we shouldn't talk about taking or making Confirmation; as with all sacraments we *receive* it. Like Baptism Confirmation is conferred only once, because it too imprints on the soul an indelible spiritual mark, or 'character' (CCC1304).

A new translation of the Confirmation rite was issued in 2015, the first major translation since the *Roman Missal*, and next week we shall look at the actual ceremony itself.
