ADVENT

A shoot springs from the stock of Jesse

Isaiah 11:1

Today's Mass: FIRST SUNDAY of ADVENT (Year B)

Today the new liturgical year begins, and this year is the Year of Mark (Year B). In the words of John Betjeman "The bells of waiting Advent ring", and Advent is a season of waiting, for Christ's coming at Christmas and His second Coming at the end of time (as the Preface for today's Mass declares). Advent is thus a period of penitential preparation, reflected in the lack of the *Gloria* at Sunday Mass, no flowers around the Altar, and the use of violet vestments. But it is also a season of joyful expectation, of joyful penance, as we prepare for the birth of our Saviour. The scriptures in Advent focus on two key figures: St John the Baptist, the forerunner of Jesus, and Mary, the Mother of Jesus.

Both the **First Reading** and the **Psalm** are communal laments, pleading with God to come and save us from our self-inflicted misery.

Second Reading: the opening words provide one of the greetings the priest may use at Mass. St Paul address the Christians at Corinth, as they "are waiting for our Lord Jesus Christ to be revealed" on the last day.

Gospel: in a parable, Jesus warns His disciples to stay ready and vigilant for the End, which may come at any time.

Pastoral Letter

+ Peter Archbishop of Southwark

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we begin a new liturgical year with the season of Advent which offers us a real sense of hope, joy and encouragement as we continue our journey of faith to celebrate the Incarnation on Christmas Day. In this short season, the liturgy encourages us to undergo a change of heart and make a new and determined effort to fulfil our responsibilities as disciples of Christ to live fully the two great commandments, to love God with our whole heart and soul, and to love our neighbour as ourselves. The prominent theme of Advent is the call to conversion and renewal, as we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus Christ at Christmas, and look forward in hope and joyful expectation to his second coming at the end of time. It gives us an opportunity to stand back a little from our busy and often hectic lives, to reflect on where we stand with God our Saviour.

We begin to capture the spirit of Advent when we hear and respond to the words of the Psalmist: "I rejoiced when I heard them say, let us go to God's house." To make our journey towards the house of our heavenly Father is to make the journey towards our ultimate end – the very reason for which God created us, and whose unconditional love, mercy and compassion for every human being we discover anew each day, if we have ears to hear and eyes to see.

Advent is a "wake up" call, expressed very well by Saint Paul in his Letter to the Romans: "You know the time has come: you must wake up now: our salvation is even nearer now than it was when we were converted. The night is almost over, it will be daylight soon – let us give up all the things we prefer to do under cover of the dark; let us arm ourselves and appear in the light." And in today's gospel reading we hear Jesus too calling us to "Stay awake, because you do not know the day when your master is coming."

In fact Christ, the light of the world, stands at the door of our hearts every day. As Saint Ambrose put it in one of his sermons, "Let your door be open to him when he comes, open your soul, throw open your inmost mind... Blessed therefore, is that man at whose door Christ knocks. Our door is faith, which if strong, fortifies the whole house. It is through this door that Christ comes in." That door can only be opened from inside and he waits patiently for us to open it and welcome him in. But too often we are so taken up with our daily cares and concerns that we either fail to hear the knock, or are simply too busy to answer it. We need to make time to listen and respond to that gentle knocking.

Wherever we are in our spiritual journey, our awareness, our belief that God loves us unconditionally, should fill us with joy, hope and consolation. That love has been revealed in the person and ministry of Jesus Christ whose birth we will celebrate again at Christmas. The spirit of Advent is the spirit of renewed hope and expectancy as we long for the coming of the Saviour into our hearts and minds – not just at Christmas, but every day. Each day we are called to become more and more like the person of Jesus Christ and model our lives on him. Then we too, in some small way, will be able to reveal to the world something of the unconditional love of God, which he offers as pure gift to everyone without exception.

But we will only be able to hold fast to Christ if we are fully awake and alert to his voice: in the scriptures, in our prayer, and when we meet him in the celebration of the sacraments, especially the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We meet him too especially in the weak, the poor, the sick and the suffering. These are 'God's little people' for whom we, like Christ himself, must have a special care and concern. In the words of our Holy Father, Pope Francis, we must become "a poor Church for the poor." We need eyes to see the needy and suffering Christ in those around us, those amongst whom we live and work. We need hearts open to the Holy Spirit who, if we ask, will fill them with the fire of God's love. And we need the support and encouragement of each other because we journey not simply as individuals but as disciples of Christ who are members of God's family, the community of faith.

So my prayer this Advent is that we will take the time to open our hearts to the gift of the Holy Spirit, asking him to deepen our faith, confirm our hope in God's promises, and help us to be more generous in our love for God and one another, especially the poor, the sick, the isolated and the suffering in our midst. In these we meet the suffering Christ, and it is in them that we truly serve him who came not to be served but to serve. "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me."

With an assurance of my prayers and blessing for you all.

From the Desk of the Parish Priest

An introduction to St Mark's Gospel



On Advent Sunday we begin Year B, the year in which the Gospel Readings at Sunday Mass are mostly taken from St Mark's Gospel.

The first Gospel?

Mark is perhaps the earliest of the three synoptic Gospels and, if so, was used as a source by Matthew and Luke. Its date is uncertain; the commonest view is that it was written in the 60s or 70s AD. If so, why is it placed second after Matthew in the Canon?

Who wrote it?

Tradition calls the author 'Mark'. Is he John Mark, who was a member of the Jerusalem Church? The second century Church Father Papias calls him "St Peter's interpreter", and it is often considered that St Peter told Mark about what Jesus said and did and he subsequently wrote his Gospel based on that.

It is unlikely that Mark was a Palestinian Jew: he is ignorant of local geography and Jewish customs and laws. He may have come from Rome: he uses Latin words (eg 'centurion' in 15:39) and Roman coinage (12:42) and time (13:35).

What is a Gospel?

Although we are thoroughly used to the word, when Mark wrote it was a new term: εὐαγγέλιον (euangelion) in Greek, which means 'good news'. Is a Gospel a biography, a Life? Is it an Acta (the acts of ...)? Is it memoirs, or history, or story-telling?

And is it historically reliable? Historians of ancient times, incidentally, regard the Gospels as reliable history of the events they record. Was the author writing with a particular purpose, and if so, what was it?

We are beginning to have more questions than answers!

The key themes

St Mark's Gospel has five main themes, which will become clear as we read through the Gospel on Sundays, especially the Sundays of Ordinary Time.

1. **Suffering:** Jesus fulfils His destiny by suffering and dying, and any disciple must likewise suffer (8:34 – 10:52).

2. The **person of Christ.** Mark has a 'high Christology': *who* Jesus is is the main question. Jesus is first of all the 'Son of God'(15:39). He is also 'Christ' or 'Son of David', and 'Son of Man'.

3. **Discipleship:** this means following Jesus in the way of the cross. The disciples show what is involved in following Jesus in the Church.

4. The **Kingdom of God:** see 1:15. The longest discourse in Galilee is the parables of the kingdom (4:1-34).

5. The **Messianic secret:** Jesus repeatedly silences those who would announce He is the Messiah (1:25, 34, 43-45, etc). In the story of Jesus there is an unfolding clarification of what Jesus must undergo and what that means for His disciples.

The lost ending

16:8 ends abruptly, in the middle of a sentence. Is the end of the manuscript lost? Was Mark taken ill, or arrested? Or is it deliberate?

Only YOU can complete the story, by following the way of the cross as a disciple of Mark's Jesus.


