Prepare a way for the Lord,
Make his paths straight

Mark 1:3

Today's Mass: SECOND SUNDAY of ADVENT (Year B)

First Reading: this was originally written in the closing years of the Babylonian exile (around 540 BC), and it confidently foretells the imminent return to Zion (ie Jerusalem) of those Jews who remain. Each of the first three Gospels saw in this passage a prefiguration of John the Baptist, who warns people to prepare for the coming of God to Mt Zion. This passage reveals God as a God of infinite power, but also of utter faithfulness and of tender love.

Psalm: a psalm asking God to come, confident that he will.

Second Reading: the writer explains the apparent delay in Christ's second coming. First, God's time is not our time. Secondly, he is being merciful in delaying, by giving us time to repent.

Gospel: the very beginning of St Mark's Gospel starts with John the Baptist, who points forward to the coming of Jesus. The few details *Mark* gives (the wilderness, John's clothes and diet, etc) and the reference to *Isaiah* reveal to those who know their scripture that the one who is coming is the Messiah.

Pope St Gregory the Great (died 604) saw the relevance of this text for every generation:

"Whoever preaches right faith and good works prepares nothing other than a road for the Lord to come into the hearers' hearts so that this gracious power might penetrate and the light of truth illuminate them. Thus may the preacher make straight paths for God, while forming pure thoughts in the soul by the word of good preaching".

Today is also **Bible Sunday**. The theme this year is *Welcome the Word*.

Mother's prayers

We do pray that you would be blessed to know that in the Parish we have groups of mothers who pray not only for their own children, but also for all children throughout the world.

This prayer movement, Mothers Prayers, has spread quickly and quietly around the world by one mother telling another mother, I'm sure under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit!! Twenty-two years on from it's humble beginnings, it has spread now into over 120 countries over six continents. We use a prayer book now translated into a great many different languages. The prayers are very simple but we are learning that they are deeply profound when we pray in a more contemplative way.

Thus, thousands of mothers are linked to each other by prayer and the common spirituality of 'surrender' to the Father's will. This means that we come before the Lord offering our children to Him completely as we place them in His hands. Whilst we may pour out our concerns for our children, we try to reach the point of 'letting go' of them and praying; 'Your will be done in their lives'. We are supported in this act of surrender by all the groups around the world as they pray; 'Lord, we unite our prayers with all the other Mothers Prayers group around the world' (p11 of the prayer book). Mary too is with us in this very act of surrender as we respond to His invitation 'Come to me all you who labour and are heavy burdened...'.

What are the fruits of this special way of praying together in unity with our sisters around the world? We have a great many testimonies of answered prayer; all sorts of addictions being broken; mental health issues improving, eating disorders being resolved, estranged relationships being reconciled, restoration of health. We have testimonies from women who have conceived when they have been told that it's not possible and children coming to faith and returning to church. We also hear of courageous mothers who grow in faith as they wait for their prayers to be answered. We have many powerful testimonies even in our own Parish.

Another fruit of this prayer of unity, is the breaking down of barriers between different Christian traditions - this is very healing and beautiful. We come together before Jesus, simply as mothers concerned for our children and all children throughout the world. Great things happen when we pray together in this way.

We praise God who is constantly about His healing business 'for He neither slumbers nor sleeps.' (Psalm 121 v4)

Sunday & Christmas Obligation & Communion

Christmas comes hot on the heels of the Fourth Sunday of Advent this year. So what is my Obligation and how often may I receive Holy Communion?

Can I come to Mass on Christmas Eve (a Sunday) and satisfy both obligations? No. Two Holydays of Obligation (the Sunday and Christmas) means two Masses. But there are different ways of satisfying the requirement: you could attend the Vigil Mass (Saturday 6:00pm) for the Sunday, and then a Christmas Eve Mass for Christmas. Or you could attend Mass on the Sunday morning (for the Sunday) and return in the evening of the same day (for Christmas), and you may receive Holy Communion on both occasions. Or you can attend Mass on the Sunday morning and then again on the Monday (Christmas) morning.

If you skip Mass on Sunday 24th because you can't face two Masses in two days and only attend a Christmas Mass, you must include it in your next Confession. Remember that the obligation does not apply to the sick, housebound and so on.

This year's Crib Service at St Thomas' will be at 5.30pm on Christmas Eve, immediately followed by the first Mass of Christmas at 6pm. All our young parishioners

in years 6 and up are invited to participate in readings and bidding prayers for the Service and Mass and to sing in our Christmas choir. Children in years 1 to 3 will take costumed roles to enact the Nativity, years 4 and 5 in reading of prayers. From the Desk of the Parish Priest

The Word of God



On Bible Sunday I would like to focus on the Word of God at Mass, that is on the Readings from the Sacred Scriptures and on those who read, often referred to as 'Ministers of the Word'.

First, let us remind ourselves of the importance the Church ascribes to the scriptures, especially when proclaimed at Mass. The Second Vatican Council said in *Dei Verbum* 21: *"The Church has always venerated the divine Scriptures as she venerated the Body of the Lord, in so far as she never ceases, particularly in the sacred liturgy, to partake of the bread of life and to offer it to the faithful from the one table of the Word of God and the Body of Christ"*.

And in *Sacrosanctum Concilium* 7 we read: *"Christ is always present in His Church, especially in her liturgical celebrations... He is present in His word, since it is He Himself who speaks when the holy scriptures are read in the Church"*.

Given the nature and importance of the Word in the liturgy it is important that those who read do so in such a way that God's Word *"may speed on in triumph and [God's] name be exalted among all peoples"* (Lectionary). God speaks to the assembly through the reader, and the impact of God's message will depend greatly on their conviction, their preparation, and their delivery.

Before Mass

The reader should read through and prepare in the week before the Sunday (ideally in the context of prayer). Above all the reader should

understand the reading so as to phrase it correctly, and practise it in advance (not least any long names!).

On arrival at Church

Arrive in good time, and check who is doing what (is a cantor singing the psalm, as it should be sung?); check the Lectionary is open at the correct place; check the amplification system is switched on. Check which Reading the priest wants if there are alternatives.

During Mass

- ◆ Come forward after the Collect, bowing to the Altar;
- ◆ always proclaim the scriptures from the Lectionary, never from the newsletter (which looks as if you are downplaying the significance of the scriptures);
- ◆ proclaim clearly, with conviction and understanding, and do not speak too quickly;
- ◆ allow a short period of silence after each Reading, to allow all to reflect on the Word of God just proclaimed;
- ◆ pause a moment before saying *'The Word of the Lord'*.

Psalm and Gospel Acclamation (Alleluia)

These are intended to be sung. In any case it can be monotonous if all the texts in the Liturgy of the Word are read. So we are trying to introduce singing the Psalm and Alleluia at Sunday Masses. This will help us all to respond prayerfully to the scripture and also restores a sense of space and meditateness to the Liturgy of the Word.
