

You have the message of eternal life, and we believe.

**Today's Mass: TWENTY-FIRST SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME (Year B)**

**First Reading:** the Israelites are at a turning point in their relationship with God, now that they have reached the Promised Land. The people elect to renew their covenant with God, to serve him alone, and to reject the gods of the land in which they now live.

**Psalm:** the final verses of Psalm 33 mirror today's *Gospel* as well as the *First Reading*: will we choose the way of God or not?

**Second Reading:** the author uses the example of marriage to explain the relationship between Christ and His Church. This image, common throughout scripture, has implications both for the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony and for our understanding of Church as the bride of Christ.

**Gospel:** today's concluding section of the Bread of Life discourse from *John* is a turning point for Jesus' disciples. Will they turn away, unable to accept His teaching? Or will they commit themselves to Jesus, despite the shadow of the cross which is beginning to fall? Peter gives a simple, heartfelt positive response: "you are the Holy One of God". In the face of the revelation of Jesus, there is no other choice.

## TEN THINGS you need to know about getting Married

Are you thinking of getting Married? Are you worried about what might be involved in a Church Wedding? Here is a ten-point guide, adapted for Sevenoaks.

1. To Marry in the Catholic Church, one of you needs to be a Catholic. The other person can be of any faith or none. You don't both have to be Catholic, and there is no requirement for the non-Catholic to convert beforehand (although if a non-Catholic fiancé(e) wishes to become a Catholic he/she will of course be most welcome to go on the RCIA course). If one party is not a Catholic you will need to obtain a dispensation, but the priest will sort this out.
2. You must be Married in a Catholic church, unless you obtain a dispensation from the Archbishop to marry elsewhere, but wherever you get Married you must contact your Parish Priest to start the process. Contact Fr David if you live in Sevenoaks parish. If you attend Mass in this parish but actually live in another, contact the Parish Priest where you live. The policy in Southwark is that you should contact the Parish Priest at least six months before the date of the Wedding.
3. Although the Church would prefer engaged couples to move in together once they are Married we will still perform the ceremony if you are 'living together'. It is never too late to put things right with God. Likewise, even if you are not attending Sunday Mass as often as you should, you should still be Married in church.
4. The Parish Priest will explain, when you first go to see him, what paperwork will be required. This will include a Baptism certificate issued within 6 months of the date of the Wedding. He will also explain the civil requirements, so that the Marriage can be civilly registered.
5. You will both need to demonstrate that you are free to Marry (ie that you are not already Married). This is normally done by swearing a Statutory Declaration of Freedom before a solicitor.
6. You will also be expected to attend, together, a diocesan Marriage Preparation Course. This consists of a Friday evening and a Saturday, at various venues throughout the year, and is principally about Married life together. Sometimes people (especially if they are not Catholic) are apprehensive about this, but invariably afterwards they very much appreciate it.
7. The normal ceremony is the full Nuptial Mass. However, if one party is a Baptized non-Catholic, you may prefer to have the Marriage without Mass, to avoid the problem of Holy Communion. If one party is not Baptized, you may only have Marriage without Mass.
8. During the ceremony you will both be asked (if you are of child bearing age) if you will accept children lovingly from God. If one or both of you do not, this would invalidate the Marriage. The Marriage would also be invalid if one or both of you are being pressurised into it, as you would not be giving consent freely.
9. If you are both Baptized, you confer the Sacrament of Matrimony on each other. The priest doesn't marry you, you marry each other, and unusually the ministers of the Sacrament are the bride and groom, not the priest.
10. Do not worry about the cost. Most of the cost of a Wedding, anyway, is the Reception, but there is no need to be extravagant about that. The actual Wedding itself is not expensive. There is a legal fee of £60 for the civil registration, and typically an organist's fee of £100. If you were getting Married in a Church of England church you would pay £424, and we suggest a similar amount as your thanksgiving donation.

## Answers to common questions: 1. Can Catholics who are divorced receive Holy Communion?



There are a lot of misunderstandings about this, so if you are concerned about this question please read this article carefully.

Let us start at the beginning. Sunday is the Day of the Lord, and since the Mass is the "most venerable sacrament" and Jesus Christ Himself commanded us to celebrate it, every Catholic should attend Mass every Sunday and Holyday of Obligation. It is only for a good and genuine reason – such as being ill or caring for an ill person, or not having transport to get to church – that a Catholic should even think of not attending Mass on a Sunday.

Furthermore, the Church teaches that it is laudable that Catholics – once they are old enough to understand what is happening – should receive Holy Communion when they attend Mass. The Church also teaches that every Catholic should receive Holy Communion at least once a year, and that this should be during Eastertide.

However, mindful of St Paul's words about receiving Holy Communion unworthily in *1 Corinthians 11:27*, the Church also teaches that "those who obstinately persist in manifest grave sin are not to be admitted to Holy Communion". So, returning to our original question, who should not receive Holy Communion?

If someone is merely separated from his or her spouse, they probably may receive Holy Communion. In some situations we might actually encourage separation, where for example a spouse or children are in danger of physical abuse. It is only if a person deliberately separates from their spouse in order to deny the Church's teaching on Marriage that they should not be admitted to Holy Communion. As this is a very unlikely scenario, it rarely applies.

What about someone who has been civilly divorced? Again, this in itself is not a bar to receiving Holy Communion. A divorced person may have been the innocent party, or divorced against their will. On the other hand, if they deliberately engineered a divorce for sinful reasons, they may not be allowed to receive Holy Communion.

What if someone is divorced and civilly remarried? This is where the difficulty lies, because such a person could be said to be "manifestly persisting in grave sin". There may be a solution to the difficulty, of course, and that is to apply to the diocesan Tribunal to have the previous Marriage annulled.

What should you do if you are asking the question above? If you think someone who shouldn't be receiving Holy Communion, you should quietly and without causing a scene speak to the priest about it. He may know the full facts of the case; if not he will tactfully enquire. But the priest will take care not to frighten off the person from attending Mass (remember, even Catholics who may not receive Holy Communion are still obliged to attend Mass). If someone does not go forward for Holy Communion, you should not jump to conclusions; there are dozens of good reasons for not receiving Holy Communion at a Mass.

If you are uncertain about receiving holy communion go and ask a priest for advice.

What should you do if you are separated, divorced, or divorced and civilly remarried, and are uncertain about receiving Holy Communion? Go and speak to Fr David, Fr Paul, or Canon John, explain your situation, and ask his advice. Our priests are not fierce ogres! They will help you to do what is best in your circumstances.

The other thing to do is to go to Confession; putting off a Confession never helped anybody. Once all your grave sins are forgiven you may be in a position to receive Holy Communion. And if it is relevant, ask the priest about getting a previous Marriage annulled.
