

Today's Mass: TWENTY-THIRD SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME (Year B)

First Reading: Isaiah portrays the glorious fulfilment of God's saving purpose at the end of time. This end-time - we believe - begins with Jesus (see the *Gospel* reading).

Psalms: this carries on the same idea as the *First Reading*: the Lord who comes to save those in need.

Second Reading: James draws out a practical implication of our faith: discrimination against different classes, especially the poor, is wrong.

Gospel: Jesus heals the deaf-mute of the Decapolis. The word used to describe his infirmity is used only twice in the Bible, here and in Isaiah 35 (today's *First Reading*). As the Isaiah prophecy is describing the end-time, this is clearly meant to be understood in this *Gospel* passage: Mark is suggesting that Jesus is not merely a good man and a healer, but is the Messiah who ushers in the kingdom of God.

Ephphatha is Aramaic for 'Be opened'. As well as being a testing word for a spelling bee (it can be spelled in English either with an 'a' or an 'e' in the middle), it forms the basis of the Ephphatha ceremony in the Baptism of Infants, in which the celebrant touches the ears and mouth of the child, which reminds us that once baptised everyone has the duty to receive Christ's word and to proclaim His faith.

the LETTER OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS
TO THE PEOPLE OF GOD

"If one member suffers, all suffer together with it" (1 Cor 12:26). These words of Saint Paul forcefully echo in my heart as I acknowledge once more the suffering endured by many minors due to sexual abuse, the abuse of power and the abuse of conscience perpetrated by a significant number of clerics and consecrated persons. Crimes that inflict deep wounds of pain and powerlessness, primarily among the victims, but also in their family members and in the larger community of believers and nonbelievers alike. Looking back to the past, no effort to beg pardon and to seek to repair the harm done will ever be sufficient. Looking ahead to the future, no effort must be spared to create a culture able to prevent such situations from happening, but also to prevent the possibility of their being covered up and perpetuated. The pain of the victims and their families is also our pain, and so it is urgent that we once more reaffirm our commitment to ensure the protection of minors and of vulnerable adults.

With shame and repentance, we acknowledge as an ecclesial community that we were not where we should have been, that we did not act in a timely manner, realizing the magnitude and the gravity of the damage done to so many lives. We showed no care for the little ones; we abandoned them.

The extent and the gravity of all that has happened requires coming to grips with this reality in a comprehensive and communal way. While it is important and necessary on every journey of conversion to acknowledge the truth of what has happened, in itself this is not enough. Today we are challenged as the People of God to take on the pain of our brothers and sisters wounded in their flesh and in their spirit. If, in the past, the response was one of omission, today we want solidarity, in the deepest and most challenging sense, to become our way of forging present and future history. And this in an environment where conflicts, tensions and above all the victims of every type of abuse can encounter an outstretched hand to protect them and rescue them from their pain (cf. *Evangelii Gaudium*, 228). Such solidarity demands that we in turn condemn whatever endangers the integrity of any person.

I am conscious of the effort and work being carried out in various parts of the world to come up with the necessary means to ensure the safety and protection of the integrity of children and of vulnerable adults, as well as implementing zero tolerance and ways of making all those who perpetrate or cover up these crimes accountable. Together with those efforts, every one of the baptized should feel involved in the ecclesial and social change that we so greatly need. This change calls for a personal and communal conversion that makes us see things as the Lord does. ... I invite the entire holy faithful People of God to a *penitential exercise of prayer and fasting*; ... this can awaken our conscience and arouse our solidarity and commitment to a culture of care that says "never again" to every form of abuse.

It is essential that we, as a Church, be able to acknowledge and condemn, with sorrow and shame, the atrocities perpetrated by consecrated persons, clerics, and all those entrusted with the mission of watching over and caring for those most vulnerable. Let us beg forgiveness for our own sins and the sins of others. An awareness of sin helps us to acknowledge the errors, the crimes and the wounds caused in the past and allows us, in the present, to be more open and committed along a journey of renewed conversion.

May the Holy Spirit grant us the grace of conversion and the interior anointing needed to express before these crimes of abuse our compunction and our resolve courageously to combat them.

Consecration Anniversary at St Thomas's

The Solemnity of the Anniversary of the Consecration (in 1935) of St Thomas's Church falls next Sunday. Masses at St Thomas's (including the Saturday evening Mass) will be of the Consecration Anniversary, not the 24th Sunday of the Year. Mass readers and musicians please note.



From the Desk of the Parish Priest

Prayer: Why Pray?



“**L**et my prayer arise before you like incense” (Psalm 140:2). The Christian life is essentially a life lived in union with God. This union was given to us in Baptism, by no merit of our own, by God in his infinite love. This union is deepened by our study of Christ and His teachings and by receiving the Sacraments, especially the Eucharist, and by our good deeds in love of neighbour. But above all our union with God is made real and present in prayer.

“Without prayer we have neither light nor strength to advance in the way which leads to God” (St Alphonsus Maria de Liguori). Prayer is so basic and fundamental to the Christian life, and yet we all struggle with it. We say our prayers when we come to Mass, and perhaps when we remember we say our morning and evening prayers, but God seems so distant. The concept of prayer as a conversation with God seems as challenging as praying in Mandarin Chinese. God, the infinite ‘Other’, does dwell eternally in heaven, yes. But he is also a God who came among us in the person of Jesus Christ and who is near and present now, the good shepherd.

“It is simply impossible to lead, without the aid of prayer, a virtuous life” (St John Chrysostom). Another difficulty with prayer is the misconception that it consists only of petition, only of asking God for things. If we don't get what we want, we stop praying. Petition is a part of prayer – witness the petition in the Lord's Prayer ‘to give us this day our daily bread’ – but only a part. Prayer, as we shall see, is much wider. It has been said that there are no atheists in battle – fair enough – but we should not see God as a sort of indulgent uncle who gives children nice presents from time to time.

“It is not enough to pray only with the tongue: we must, according to the Apostle, pray also with the heart if we wish to receive God's graces, praying at all times in the spirit” (St Alphonsus Maria de Liguori). Prayer should be as natural a part of human life as eating and sleeping, but yet it isn't – thanks to the Fall of Adam and Eve - and we do have to learn it and be determined to practice it. But the same is true of learning a musical instrument or training to be an athlete. The more we put in the more we receive. To quote St Alphonsus again: *“he who prays most receives most”*. This is the answer to the question which is often asked, ‘is it any good praying when I don't feel like it?’

“Prayer is the lifting up of the mind to God” (St John Damascene). We come now to consider what prayer is, and this definition has become classical, and penetrates to the root of the matter. Ordinarily our thoughts are occupied with everyday matters, of greater (eg shall I marry this person?) or lesser (who will win Love Island?) importance. In prayer we deliberately put all these aside and ‘lift up our hearts’ to God himself, and enter into loving dialogue with him. In prayer the soul comes to God, not to ‘say its prayers’ but to find him and be with him.

“Pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Someone, much more holy and prayerful than me, once wrote that


‘Prayer is work;
Prayer is important work;
Prayer is hard work;
Prayer is my work’.

Prayer is living life in the presence of God, always aware of him, listening to him, referring things to him, responding to him in love and thanksgiving. If this is so, we will want to train ourselves in prayer, to come ever closer to the God *“in whom we live and move and have our being”* (Acts 17:28).

When Jesus was alone with the deaf man, he touched his ears and tongue


